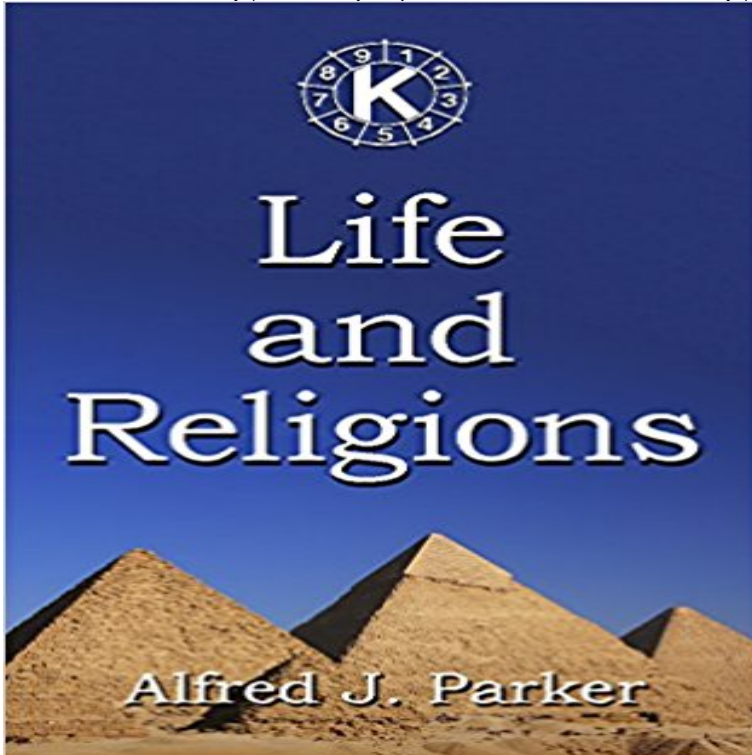


Life & Religions (Symbolism in Religion Series Book 1)

Outside of mathematics it would seem that there is no complete balance, no complete logic, and no solution to human problems. The Holy Bible starts with the first book of Moses (Genesis) based upon the days and the creativeness of mathematics: the quantity and quality of days, their significance, and also the cyclic law of time as related to the creation; to wit: how God created the world in seven days, and rested. A thinker must notice the predominance of numbers in the explanation of creation. Then there is the Book of Revelation, the last book of the Scripture, which is based upon mathematics; it concerns St. Johns vision in heaven where he was permitted to view the lifting of the seals of the great book of life. Revelation is a book of mathematical symbology and is considered the book of mystery that no man can logically translate.
